You could not have known all you needed to illuminate your way.


When you travel, a new silence goes with you. And if you listen, you will hear what your heart would love to say. A journey can become a sacred thing.

Celebrant: A reminder that ALL are welcome at this table.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to God


All: It is right to give God thanks and praise

Celebrant: Before going out into the wilderness of the Garden, Jesus sat down to eat and drink with his friends.

To show them the challenge of the way ahead, and offer them gifts for that journey, he took bread – sustaining and wholesome – and poured wine – earthy and warming – sharing these as signs of his continuing presence with them throughout time to come. And now, remembering that moment, and recognizing that its promise is also for us in this time and place,

#### **Invitation to Eucharist:**

So come, all you who are tired and travel-stained, footsore and famished; come with your fellow travelers and find companionship and comfort;



A reminder that ALL are welcome at God's table.


Please remain seated until it is your turn to come to the altar.

All are welcome at God's table! Please follow the row in front of you to come forward. You may choose to receive both the bread and the wine or the bread only. To receive bread, simply hold out your hands, or for Gluten free wafers cover one hand over the other. Wine will be offered by sipping from the Cup only. If you wish to receive a blessing, simply cross your arms over your chest. If you are unable to come forward, please notify an usher and communion will be brought to you.

May They bring you home rejoicing


At the wonders they have shown you;

## March 16, 2025: Holy Wandering

March this year includes the Spring Equinox 3/20 and Lent.

March is the second month within the Celtic season of Imbolc [imm' ulk], the Spring quarter of the Celtic year. It is a time of lengthening light with the Spring Equinox (March 20), opening buds and warming ground, a time of renewal in heart and mind as well as earth. In the Christian calendar, in 2025, March is entirely devoted to the holy wandering and searching of Lent in preparation for Holy Week and Easter in April.
